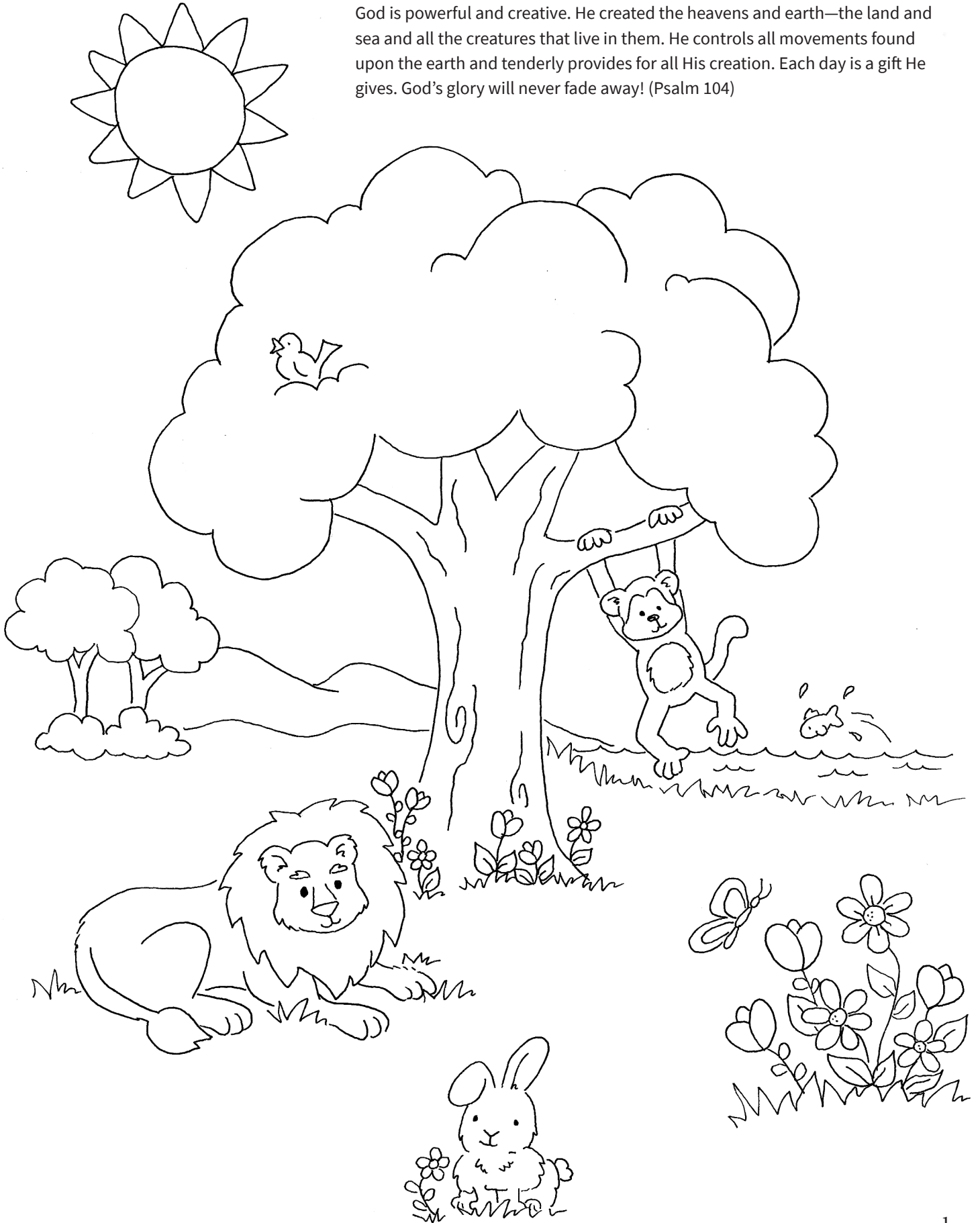
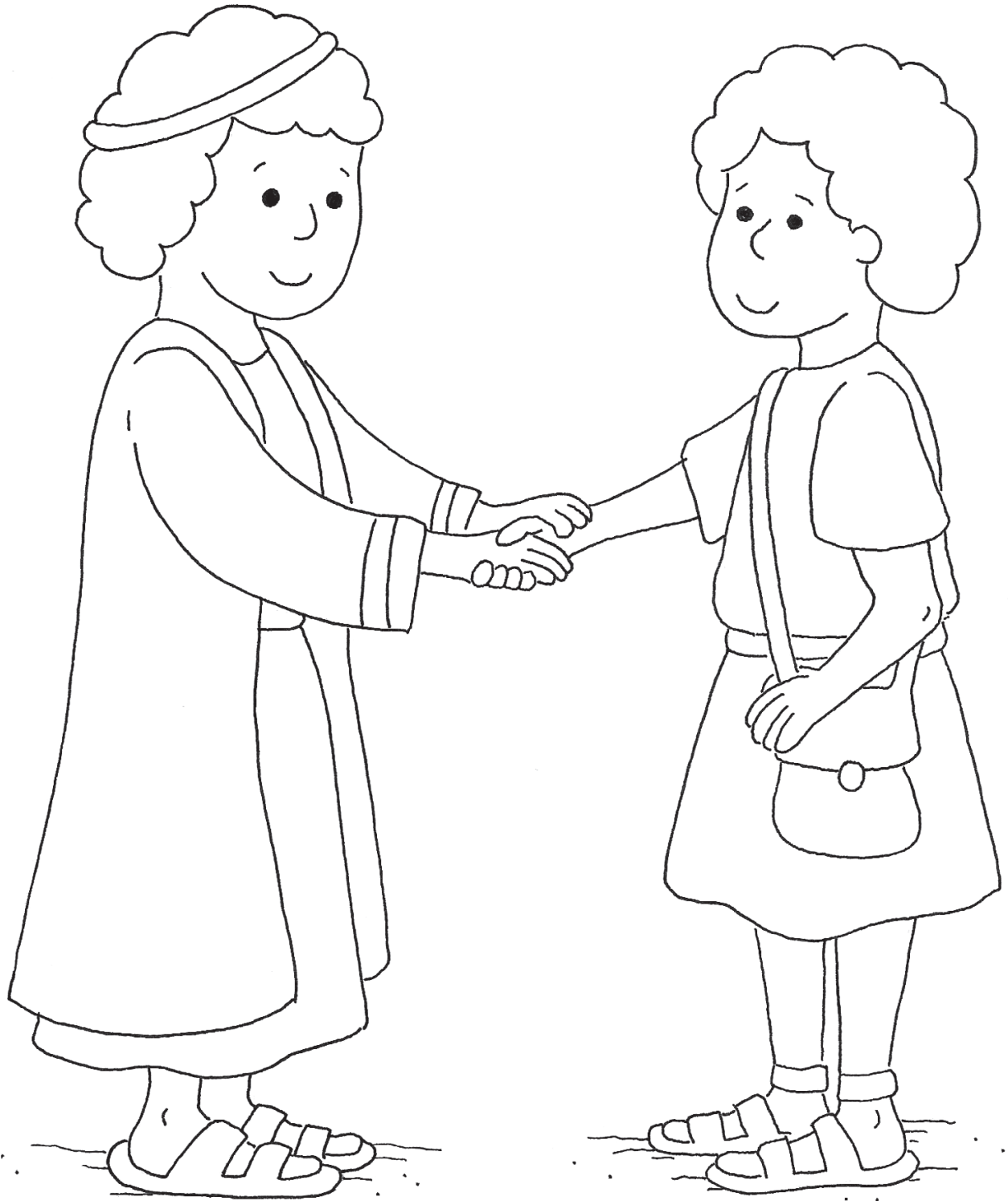


Lesson 1: Who is God?

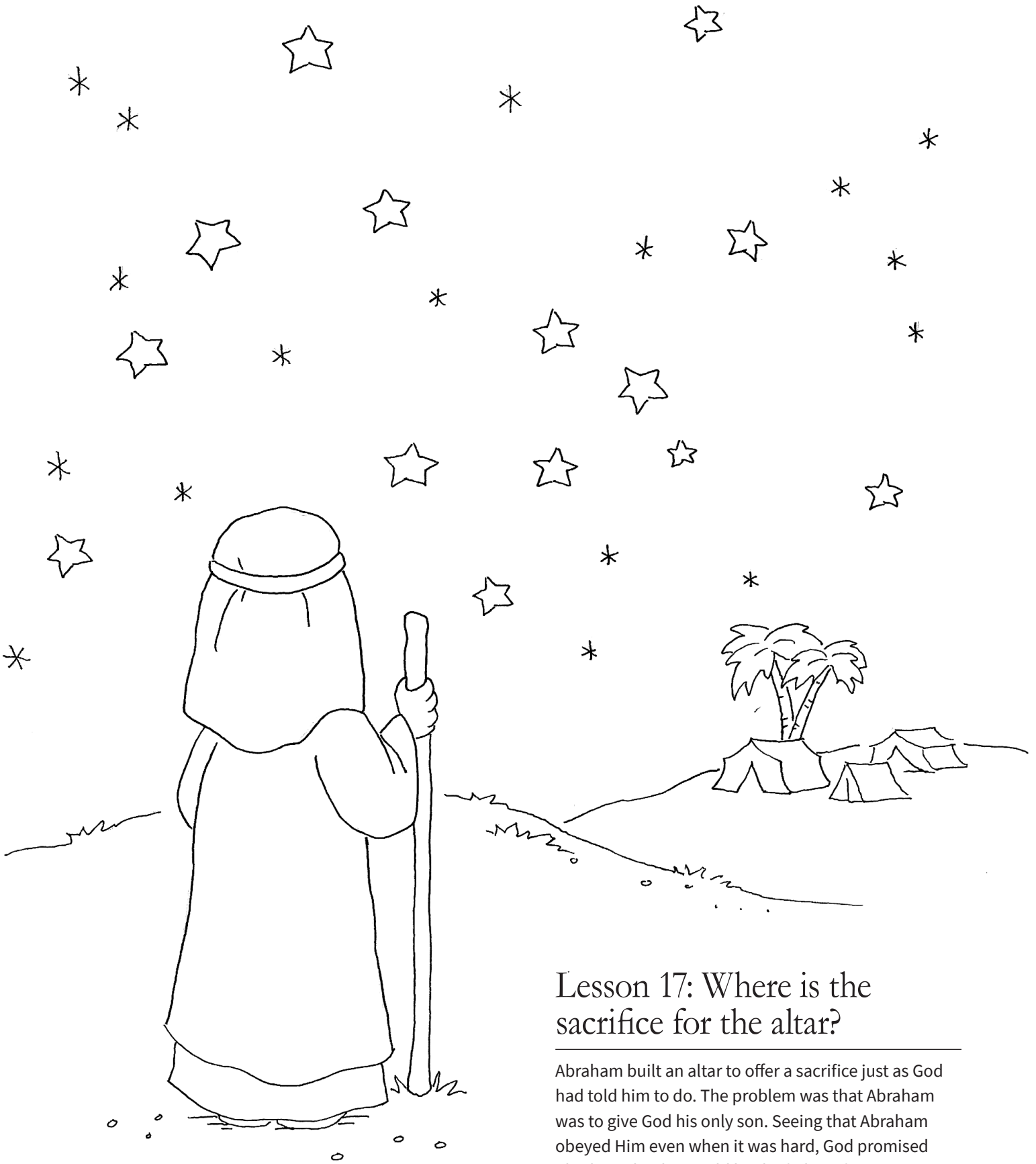
Lesson 2: What is a covenant?
